Thank you for your assistance and attention to this matter.

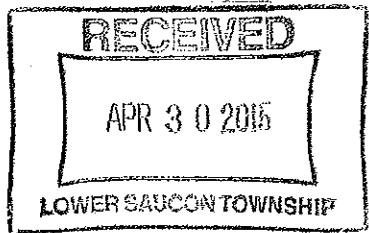

Dear Senator Boscola and Representatives Simmons and Freeman:

Thank you for your recent letter regarding offsite odors alleged to be originating from IESI Pa Bethlehem Landfill (IESI) off of Applebutter Road in Lower Saucon Township, Northampton County.

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) recognizes that IESI at times causes odors, which may be detected off the landfill property and cause inconvenience to citizens that live near or travel in the vicinity of the landfill. DEP has received complaints alleging detection of odors originating from IESI or the Bethlehem Landfill Gas Facility operated by Bethlehem Renewable Energy, LLC (BRE) that is located adjacent to the landfill. However, to date investigations in response to these complaints have not verified offsite odors of sufficient character, duration and/or intensity to meet the threshold of a "malodor" violation as defined by the DEP rules and regulations (Sec 25 Pa. Code §121.1). Also, recent inspections of IESI and BRE have not noted operational violations by those facilities.

As explained to Lower Saucon Township Officials in a meeting with DEP representatives on June 24, 2014, DEP will continue to investigate odor complaints and potential sources of the odor. These investigations of odor complaints are documented in reports which are provided to the township. If an odor cannot be determined to meet the definition of a malodor and the odor source cannot conclusively be traced to a source or an operational failure at the landfill or the gas facility, DEP cannot conclude that IESI or BRE is in violation.

DEP is also investigating both IESI and BRE gas management as a possible source of odors as related to the nexus of gas use/flow balance between IESI and BRE. DEP is evaluating BRE's gas management during shut down/start-up activity as a possible source of odors. DEP's Air Quality Program and Waste Management Program continue to work closely together on this matter. In addition, DEP inspections will concentrate on the suitability of cover material to prevent odors.

On March 24, 2015, IESI notified DEP that IESI scheduled the construction of a minimum of 4 landfill gas vertical wells, 4 horizontal landfill gas collectors with connection to the landfill gas
