8 **A. Call to Order: Ed Inghrim**

14 **C. Council of Governments**

- 15  
16 1. Minutes of the September 10, 2008 meeting were presented and approved on a motion by  
17 Mayor Fluck seconded by Tom Maxfield.  
18  
19 2. Checking Account - Jack said in the balance in the checking account as of September 30,  
20 2008 is \$29,322.98. During the month of September, we paid EPD \$1,539.43.  
21  
22 3. Treasurer’s Report - Jack said the balance in the Treasurer’s Report as of September 30,  
23 2008 is \$7,961.35. During the month of September, we paid the charges for Federal  
24 Express for mailing documents and for transcription services for a total of \$101.80.  
25 Motion for approval to accept the Treasurers report was made by Glenn, second by Jane.  
26 All in favor.  
27

28 Approval to pay bills - Jack said we have two bills to pay: one for EPD for their services  
29 of August 1 to August 31, 2008 of \$2,576.87. He reviewed the bill and he recommends  
30 approval to pay. Motion for approval to pay EPD in the amount of \$2,576.87 was made  
31 by Tom, seconded by Mayor Fluck. All in favor. Jack said the second bill was for  
32 transcription services to Diane Palik in the amount of \$60.00 for September 10, 2008.  
33 Motion for approval to pay Diane Palik’s bill was made by Glenn, seconded by Tom. All  
34 in favor.  
35

36 **D. Citizens Commenting on Agenda Items:**

37  
38 Gail Nolf said in the Draft Comprehensive Plan, she read through the entire verbiage and the one  
39 comment she’ll make is that contrary to what it says, most of the recreation activities or organized  
40 sporting activities take place in the Borough like football, soccer, baseball. With the opening of  
41 Polk Valley Park, there are more organized sporting activities taking place in the Township. She  
42 said Southeastern has very nice facilities as well as Town Hall.  
43

44 Margie Segaline asked what is the status on the Leithsville sewer project? Usually we just hear  
45 there are no changes. Jack said on Leithsville 537 Plan, the last status update was several months  
46 ago, and at that time the Borough had sent a list of issues and concerns to the Lower Saucon  
47 Authority about the proposed route for the line through Hellertown and the LSA has taken some  
48 time to discuss and review these issues and put together a response. That response has not been  
49 sent back to the Borough at this point, so the issue is kind of hanging and we haven’t been given  
50 any update on that. This goes back to December or January of this year. Margie asked did that  
51 project evolve around water and sewer? Jack said it’s a sanitary sewer line to service that area.  
52

Susan Baxter and Jennie McKenna arrived. The time was 7:06 PM.

2 Sandy Yerger said with regard to the historic sites for Lower Saucon Township in the Draft Comp  
3 Plan, it should be updated to reflect that the Lutz-Franklin Schoolhouse just earned a nomination  
4 to the National Register of Historic Sites. It's usually understood when Pennsylvania Historic  
5 and Museum Commission says it's a go, it's a go. They were very much in favor of it.  
6

7 **E. Citizens Commenting on Non-Agenda Items:**  
8

9 Margie Segaline said she wanted to congratulate the Lower Saucon Township Historical Society  
10 on the events yesterday. That's a huge accomplishment and it's obvious that from the Borough  
11 historical standpoint, as well as Lower Saucon, and they are really joining together. On the 25<sup>th</sup>  
12 of this month, there is going to be a living history day, the first time in probably 20 years. All the  
13 groups are going to be doing activities during the day in the community.  
14

15 Jennie McKenna said she'd like to request to talk about access roads and speed limits and have a  
16 sub-committee to get together and talk about that and get it on the Partnership's agenda. There's  
17 some research that has to be done where signs have to be placed and whether or not the District  
18 Magistrate will enforce it and where. She thinks it's perfect here as it's a cooperative effort.  
19 She'd like everyone to think about it. Ed Inghrim said issue of signage came up at the County  
20 COG meeting, and it's very worthwhile.  
21

22 **F. Saucon Valley Multi-Municipal Comprehensive Plan**  
23

24 **1. Draft Multi-Municipal Comprehensive Plan**  
25

26 Carolyn Yagle was present. She said they were at the Joint Planning Commission  
27 meeting that was conducted in September and they were very happy to be part of that in  
28 terms of what took place and the information that they were able to share with everyone  
29 and how they were able to talk to the two groups. This evening, they also have an update  
30 of the draft plan that they are looking to move forward on. Next week they are going to  
31 meet with both Planning Commissions and then come on Wednesday to the Township  
32 Council to give a heads up on what may be coming forth. At the September Planning  
33 Commission meeting, in preparation of getting together with them for next time, they put  
34 together an Executive Summary which she will hand out, multiple pages of words and  
35 highlights. There's an overview of the plan and major goals. As an extension of their  
36 last discussion, they also put together a draft for all of you to consider, the handout that  
37 was talked about that you could have at your municipal buildings and the school district.  
38 The community can get an idea of what the comprehensive plan is about. We want to  
39 keep this brief in terms of the revisions, and then we've been moving forward on how we  
40 want to get this to the Planning Commission and Council for their consideration and  
41 comment, and then get it to the public during the public review period. They've been  
42 able to incorporate the comments they received at the Joint Planning Commission  
43 meeting and their recognition of the super summary, eight pages that we handed out.  
44 That was the type of information that people in the previously provided comment section  
45 were interested in seeing, so that was helping them to summarize these key items. There  
46 is some information that overlaps between the two types of executive summaries, but in  
47 regard to the overall application, how you can use these two documents, the glossy type  
48 and the other is for the Planning and Council members to keep at their meetings, so it will  
49 be right at their finger tips.  
50

51 AJ Schwartz said the meetings they had at the Planning Commission, through the  
52 meetings, the Planning Commissions are the ones that really triggered the summary.  
53

54 Carolyn said if there are comments you have in the next couple of weeks with both of  
55 these documents, please let them know. AJ said the super summary has more

1 information. Carolyn said the other item they wanted you to think about was the update  
2 and the recognition of the recreation activities in the community and they will be getting  
3 those types of comments and support from the Planning Commission. They anticipate  
4 doing that this evening with the SVP, if they are okay with them coming to next week's  
5 Planning Commission meeting as that will be the time they can have a digital version to  
6 present, and the next step would be for the Planning Commissions to make a  
7 recommendation for it to officially go to each Council. Each Council would then  
8 recognize it as ready to go to the 45 day official public review period which is the next  
9 step. In terms of the school district, this phase as we move into the public review period,  
10 there's the resolution component to it that they are recognizing and looking forward to.  
11 The school district has the timeframe, the 45 days to make comments on the plan. Ed  
12 Inghrim said if we can get nine copies of the document and give it to the Board, forty-five  
13 days is more than ample time for them to look at it. Carolyn said the information they  
14 just found out before 7:00 PM this evening, relates to recognition of some of the natural  
15 resource areas in Lower Saucon Township that have been on the plans somewhere  
16 through the LVPC for a couple of years, and there have been a few other natural resource  
17 areas that have some significance to be identified in the comprehensive plan. Sandy  
18 Yerger said you actually have them under sensitive natural resources; you just don't have  
19 them named. She said the LVPC updated their natural resource inventory which they  
20 were not aware of at the Township. It means there are more naturally sensitive areas in  
21 the eastern and southern portion of the Township than otherwise noted. Carolyn said it  
22 also translates into, the township down the road, will look at how natural resources can be  
23 evaluated as part of the development process or applications for development as there's a  
24 little bit more detailed information that the Township can look to from a regional  
25 perspective and call on that as a resource as part of it's ordinances or other types of  
26 applications so that impacts density or types of development, things like that. That's how  
27 it falls into the bigger picture down the road. One of the things she wants to highlight in  
28 terms of incorporation of the plan is the Mission Statement. They had talked about this a  
29 good bit with Hellertown Planning Commission, recognizing that they are interested in  
30 putting together sort of a snapshot statement of what this plan was all about.

31  
32 Carolyn said turn to page 2 of the glossy handout and at the top, the 3<sup>rd</sup> line, the plan  
33 seeks to promote balanced growth that will enhance and maintain the resident's quality of  
34 life and the distinctive character of each community by capitalizing on natural, cultural,  
35 residential and economical assets. That's where it sort of falls into the whole gambit of  
36 things, the key being the balanced growth. That was something we've learned over the  
37 last two years in terms of whether its population, impact on the resources, whether it's  
38 how traffic is going to be coursing through the communities or beyond the communities,  
39 looking at those components. At the Joint Planning Commission meeting, they discussed  
40 that statement and said it was an important piece to tie things together.

41  
42 Margie Segaline said the communities are using small signage along the road, whether  
43 it's a historical site or a park or a stream, we don't have a lot of that, in Hellertown and  
44 Lower Saucon and she doesn't know how costly that is. It could be adjacent to the  
45 property. She thinks that any newcomer would really be more at an advantage of  
46 learning the area if there were more signage. There are some signs that are different  
47 colors pointing out properties, but she thought she'd bring that up as it's really important.  
48 Mayor Fluck said that's a code on their sign ordinance. Carolyn said there is the  
49 component in the plan about the civic and open space components trying to get that  
50 established where you have the opportunity, once you are together. You were talking  
51 about it could be directions to the school or orientation to open space to the walking paths.  
52 Margie said when you are coming into the borough, there are the welcome signs. On  
53 those welcome signs, the historical sites should be listed, even if it's just a small little  
54 sign as people will slow down a little if they are interested and read what those signs have  
55 to say. Lower Saucon has to start working on welcome signs also.

1  
2 Ed said at the County COG meeting, there was an individual there that gave a report on  
3 signage, and they indicated that PennDOT is in the process of coming up with a set of  
4 standards of signage through the entire state of Pennsylvania. One of the things that  
5 popped into his mind was that we really need to understand where PennDOT is going  
6 before we make any decisions in terms of putting new signage in the community. Jack  
7 said that has to do with traffic sign standards such as reflectivity.  
8

9 Tom Harp said Mike Stursich from Lehigh Valley Convention & Visitors Bureau was  
10 looking at any type of attraction that would bring visitors in and they are looking at 412  
11 as an official point of doing some things, but they are open to any suggestions from this  
12 organization about the issues you brought up, so get that out to Mike. They are trying to  
13 get tourism and visitors in here. Ed said it might be a good idea to have him at one of the  
14 COG meetings to give us some ideas of what their thinking is. Jack said Sandy is here  
15 from the Historic Committee and can talk about the historic markers they are working on.  
16 Sandy said there is signage and verbiage for non-PHMC sites that are locally significant.  
17 They've selected a few already like the Meadows Road Bridge which they know will not  
18 make PHMC standards. The Redington Chapel, before it was demolished, was a  
19 significant structure, so we are looking at signage for those. We already worked on the  
20 verbiage, and we are going to have signs in the Township that are consistent. She has no  
21 objection if we want to work on this for the Borough and the Township. The only thing  
22 she will caution you on, and it's her personal view, she lives in a very rural area in the  
23 Township and she takes exception to a lot of the signage. One of the attractions is the  
24 fields, etc. and you start putting a lot of signs up, you have to be very careful and  
25 respectful of how much signage you put out there. If you have a specific site, that's a  
26 different story. We have to keep parameters on other sites. We have a few areas in the  
27 Township where we already have so many signs and no one pays any attention to any of  
28 them. That's just a word of caution. They are ready to go forward with two of the sites  
29 already. She has no objection and can take it back to the Lower Saucon Historic  
30 Committee if you want to do a joint venture with Hellertown. Ed said his concern was if  
31 they didn't know what they were developing; somebody from PennDOT knocks on the  
32 door of Hellertown Borough and says you have to take that sign down because it doesn't  
33 have the specification put in place, particularly in this area, because of the casino. They  
34 want to begin to develop a very different view of how people view Lehigh Valley. He  
35 was only worried about that. Sandy said she agrees. If there is a standard we have to  
36 adhere to, why do it two or three times. Did they give you any indication when these  
37 determinations might come through? Ed said he doesn't remember a final date.  
38

39 Tom Maxfield said what we do have, existing, is a couple of years ago we got all the  
40 signs by the major creeks in the area and we have all the park signs. The only thing we  
41 really don't have is the welcome signs. Margie said are there signs coming from the  
42 major corridors? Tom said that's what we don't have and we have to work on that.  
43 Margie said that's really important to newcomers. Tom said he liked the idea of the signs  
44 at the beginning and end of the watersheds.  
45

46 Carolyn said our goal this evening is to find out if coming next week to the Planning  
47 Commission meetings and the Lower Saucon Township Council meeting, and if the  
48 Steering Committee is okay with them doing that, then can get that underway.  
49

50 AJ said in terms of the draft you have, you have seen the action plans and the changes in  
51 the document that were cleaned up. Carolyn said recognition of Hellertown as a small  
52 town versus an urban town. She is going to call and ask Tom or Jennie for any items they  
53 could share with the Steering Committee what was discussed and the momentum that was  
54 established and how that can fold into next weeks discussion, then as we move onto  
55 Planning Commission's consideration for Council. Jennie said the Joint Planning

1 Commission meetings, the magic started happening when you turned it over to them and  
2 left them to talk it over. It was a lot of reinforcing of each others goals. There was the  
3 comment that one of the Lower Saucon Township planners said he thought there were  
4 more recreation facilities in the Township and that was the only meager type of comment.  
5 Tom said he thinks his comment about the recreational facilities was geared towards who  
6 is going to pay for things. That is that particular Planning Commission member's  
7 concern; who is going to pay for what. Someone said there is certainly excitement with  
8 both Planning Commissions. They had energy about how do they keep this going.  
9 Carolyn said it would fold into their enthusiasm of how do we get together as a joint body  
10 for that type of meeting, recognizing they each have their own activities and they need to  
11 dive into detail about certain subjects. There was that momentum.  
12

13 Someone asked if the Action Plan jumped out with the two Planning Commissions? Tom  
14 said he thought there was a little bit of discussion about the sports and recreation. Ed said  
15 that's an area of where the school should be involved with that process. AJ said there  
16 wasn't a lot of discussion on specific items. In terms of each Planning Commission and  
17 their respective community, it was almost that each of the Planning Commission's, once  
18 this plan is adopted, they almost want to be able to convene to kind of go through, here's  
19 the stuff we need to focus on and here's the stuff you guys need to focus on, and what  
20 needs to be done jointly, and that seemed like those would be the next steps and things  
21 that are bright benchmarks to hit. There are things they need to do to get to those  
22 benchmarks. They are the ones that triggered that. Tom said it was real apparent that we  
23 have different goals, but those goals matched. At one point there was a question asked if  
24 Lower Saucon is comfortable reinforcing the hub with the Borough being kind of a center  
25 or hub? We said of course, it makes all the sense in the world. The Planner's working  
26 together and finding out where those mixed areas are, we all realize we can have these  
27 different goals and it will work. Everybody respected what everyone else wanted and  
28 there was no tension or anything like that. From a planning perspective, it all makes  
29 sense. He felt real good after he came out of that meeting and felt they really made some  
30 contact.  
31

32 Jennie said reinforcing the relationship, the understanding of their connectivity, there was  
33 someone that made the comment about making sure the zoning in the Township on the  
34 east side was matching what was protecting of the watershed, and that was brought up by  
35 a Township resident knowing that the water supply was in Hellertown, but it also went  
36 back out to the Township. The overall grasp they had, they were truly way past us. AJ  
37 said there were some very specific questions and as the plan starts to evolve, people will  
38 be drawn down to some very specific things, and that watershed protection was clearly  
39 something that both bodies, there is interest and concerns about as they are sharing  
40 common resources. Carolyn said we can, bring this forward to next week.  
41

42 Jack said next week, are you coming on October 15 to the Township and then October 16  
43 to the Planning Commission? Carolyn said the intent of the meeting on the 14<sup>th</sup>, with  
44 Hellertown Planning Commission is to recap and put in front of them the document for  
45 their consideration and potential recommendation that they would be able to move  
46 forward to Council for Council's review and consideration. As a technicality in the  
47 process, the MPC has to have that happen. On the 15<sup>th</sup>, considering talking to Council, it  
48 would not be presenting them with a formal document because we need to go to the  
49 Planning Commission. We will be able to make some introductions about some specifics  
50 of the plan. On the 16<sup>th</sup>, the Lower Saucon Planning Commission would be looking to  
51 have more discussion and their considerations for putting something out to move towards  
52 Council and that would move us to later fall. That's the intention of these meetings. Jack  
53 said they will put them on the agenda for the 15<sup>th</sup>. Charlie said the intent would probably  
54 be to come back to the Hellertown Council on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November as they have to first  
55 go through the Hellertown Planning Commission.

Carolyn said they will forward the digital copies.

**G. Brief Reports and Discussion Items**

**1. Casino Impacts Funding – update**

Jack said there was no update. He's tried to get a copy of the Erie County Court decision that Jennie referred to, but it's not published yet. That case was where the judge was making an interpretation of the law in terms of how the casino grants were supposed to be distributed to the County and the municipalities.

**2. Joint COG Projects**

Jack said we delayed the paving in the Township until the fall because of the high cost of asphalt this summer. We just resumed it this week with the help of the Hellertown Borough Public Works and should complete that within the next two weeks. At the end of that, we will send out the press release that talks about the savings at the school through the joint paving project.

**3. Polk Valley Road/Walnut Street Intersection Enhancements – update**

Jack said for the Polk Valley Road/412 traffic signal, they submitted the traffic signal application to PennDOT. They just got it back. There are a couple of pages of comments from PennDOT and he showed them to the Engineer. The Engineer said there is a new Engineer at PennDOT who just got started. There are three pages of minor adjustments to the plan. That's going to be taken care of. They had to update some curb improvements and as soon as that's done, they'll send that back in and wait. Charlie said he thinks the same engineer is working on their Walnut Street plans. They got a list of fifteen items that have to be taken care of. Most of them are minor, but the ADA is the major one. They explained that any ADA has to go through a whole series of investigations, and the Executive Director of the District has to sign off on it. We've got some very steep slopes where there is no landing. These plans were approved in 2003 and we've struggled through litigation since then. They've approved them for extensions each year. The argument here is there's a variance as we followed what the plan was in the first place. The rest of the fifteen items are minor. We are going after replacement of pre-empts. We need to do something with the police department as they were lost in the Ivan flooding in the basement. John Bate said the pre-empts for the ambulance squad, don't work for some reason, so they have to be repaired.

Glenn Kern asked if there was any timeframe for the traffic light at Polk Valley? Jack said he doesn't know how long it will take to get approval, but he can ask Jim Birdsall. He doesn't know where we are in line. Those comments the letter just came in this week and then it goes back to PennDOT and goes up through another layer.

Charlie said he doesn't know if this is a malfunction or not, but he was coming up from the Grist Mill two days ago, and he was the only car coming from that direction to that intersection, and he was waiting for the light to turn green, before he could even hit the gas, it was changing yellow already. It did that a couple of times. There were four cars lined up to make a turn on Main Street.

**4. Joint Enterprise Zone with City of Bethlehem – update**

Charlie said he talked to Wayne Wassler from Bethlehem today and they are still interviewing their Coordinator. They did get approval for the enterprise zone, but they

1 still have to have that person come to talk to the Borough and Freemansburg. They have  
2 not forgotten about us.  
3

4 **5. Hellertown – Lower Saucon Compost Center – update**  
5

6 Jack said they are going to have a meeting of the Joint Yard Waste Recycling Committee  
7 to look over the draft budget that was put together by the two municipalities. It will be  
8 then taken back to the Borough and the Township to present to their Councils for their  
9 approval. Charlie said the number of visits is up. We surpassed last years total by the  
10 end of September with the number of visits. We are documenting multiple visits as was  
11 recommended. Two weeks ago, all of the yard waste material was ground up and he  
12 thinks we have about 50 tons of material.  
13

20 No update. Jack said this was waiting for State DCED to assign a consultant to us. He  
21 doesn't know, but they could be undermanned.

27 **9. Other Issues (Meeting of Northampton County COGs' PSATS Conference Offer)**  
28

29 Tom Harp said the County's proposed 2009 budget is now online if you'd like to look at  
30 it. At this point, there's no tax increase proposed. There are some concerns about the  
31 future of the prison and jail and increased population, etc. If you'd like to look it over  
32 before the Council's first meeting, that would be great. The recycling event that the  
33 County helped coordinate this past Saturday at Nazareth Middle School was quite  
34 successful. They had a pretty good turnout and it worked out pretty well. There is  
35 another event coming up; a household hazardous waste event which is this Saturday at  
36 Northampton Community College. Spread the word as we haven't had one in two years  
37 as they are very expensive to put on. This is a good way to dispose of your hazardous  
38 waste. We'd like a good turnout this Saturday. The Environmental Action Committee's,  
39 and hopefully, both the municipalities have submitted their information. The tree  
40 revitalization program, the deadline has passed for the fall planting and there are only two  
41 municipalities that we heard of and that was Easton and Tatamy which will be planting  
42 this fall right on time. Other municipalities will be applying by the December 1<sup>st</sup> deadline  
43 for the spring planting and he doesn't know where that will be held. They had the joint  
44 meeting of the Northampton County COGS and municipalities were invited which was  
45 on September 23, 2008, and they will be getting the minutes out real soon. Their  
46 prescription program card discount, according to the first month report for August, there  
47 are 437 prescriptions filled with an average savings of \$11.70 per prescription or 27% of  
48 the prescription cost. They are going to be putting signs in LANTA buses in three weeks.  
49 They did send out a letter about updating municipal listings on our County websites. He  
50 did bring along both Hellertown and Lower Saucon so just look over the material. It  
51 gives you an opportunity to put a little story or summary together on your community and  
52 some demographics, as they want to update it. Ed said he wanted to mention about the  
53 meeting as the issue of homeland security came up and it was recognized at that meeting  
54 that Hellertown and Saucon Valley, with the school, is leading the Lehigh Valley area in  
55 terms of how they are setting the benchmark. They are recognizing the school as the

1 driver behind it. You might want to mention it to your emergency services that they are  
2 doing a great job. Margie asked about the household hazardous waste event, and Jack  
3 said it was in the newspapers and on the Township and EAC websites.  
4

5 Jack said the Electronics Recycling drop-off day for Lower Saucon Township is Saturday,  
6 October 18, 2008 from 9:00 AM to noon.  
7

8 Jack said Priscilla deLeon asked about the Junior Council Members. He did mention that  
9 they contacted Principal Todd Gombos at the High School to try and recruit juniors and  
10 seniors for the program from the Borough and Township and we are waiting for  
11 candidates.  
12

13 Mayor Fluck said he wanted to mention that the Borough received its annual Act 904  
14 recycling grant award for \$10,000. Jack said DEP is auditing their recycling grant  
15 applications which are done by their consultant. Hellertown is also in compliance with  
16 DEP because they are doing the curbside pickups  
17

### 18 **Rails-to-Trails**

19  
20 Jack said an update on the rails to trails; the Solicitor is working on the draft of the lease  
21 agreement sent to us by SEPTA. It didn't appear to be too big of a problem. There were  
22 some language issues that we need to clean up so it was sent back to SEPTA with some  
23 comments. The contractor is moving slowly north of Coopersburg to Upper Saucon and  
24 they are clearing the trees in the rail line. They should be slowly coming up here. They  
25 are taking up the rails and the ties. Someone asked do you know what the trail will look  
26 like and what type of paving materials you will be using? Jack said the four communities  
27 briefly discussed that and we plan on getting an Advisory Committee together to discuss  
28 those issues. Charlie said we will have to get the Engineers together and talk about that.  
29 Our concern is to get SEPTA to remove all the other apparatus, so they have put a request  
30 for them to do that as the contractor is not going to take any of that out. There's some  
31 things that need to be addressed...some fallen poles and some other things. Charlie said  
32 they received caution on doing that, just do what you have to do, but don't look for things.  
33 At the Grist Mill, they are going to have to go in there and try to get that culvert open.  
34 Jack said they found a culvert down by Bingen that is blocked also. They went in  
35 underneath and it's either caved in or blocked. That's the type of thing the Engineers are  
36 going to have to look at. They'll have to look at the railings over the bridges also. On  
37 the surfaces, we'll hopefully get into a grant for that money. Jack said some of the other  
38 rail trails have different surfaces, so they'll have to look into that and it's up to the  
39 municipality to decide.
