Car Washing: The Facts and what YOU can do to help!

During the spring and summer months, most people are partaking in car washing whether it be at their home or at a car wash. Many individuals are often not aware that when washing all of the dirt off of their vehicles, they are actually causing harm to the local waterways. When water enters the storm drains, it does not undergo any type of treatment before it runs into waterways. The dirty water will usually end up in rivers, streams, creeks, and lakes. The pollution associated with car washing lowers the water quality and impacts different habitats in the world. When washing your car, issues are being caused if you do not know where or how to do it the correct way.

Did you know that using a commercial car wash is actually the safest for the environment? It minimizes the effects on the environment because most locations reuse the wash water multiple times before sending it out to a treatment plant.

Individuals may still choose to wash their cars at home or on the street, but should know that they can still do a few things to improve the water quality such as:

- Using biodegradable, phosphate-free, water-based cleaners only.
- Minimizing water usage by using a spray gun with flow restriction to control water volume and runoff.
- Wash on an area that absorbs water, such as gravel, or grass. This can filter water before it enters groundwater, storm drains, or creeks. Avoid washing cars on concrete or asphalt pavement unless it drains into a vegetated area.
- Only let wash water soak into the ground as long as you are using biodegradable, phosphate-free cleaners.
- When planning a car wash fundraiser, try developing a partnership with a commercial car wash facility, or use a safe location.
- Always empty wash buckets into sinks or toilets.



LOWER SAUCON FIRE RESCUE

Lower Saucon Fire Rescue, together with Steel City Volunteer Fire Company, is pleased to announce the consolidation of the Steel City Volunteer Fire Company into the Lower Saucon Fire Rescue has been completed. This consolidation has completed the process of combining the four original Lower Saucon Township fire companies into one entity.

The department is proud of its combined 175 years of service to the community, as our history and foundation have been and will continue to be essential building blocks for success.

In 2012, the Se-Wy-Co and Leithsville Fire Company became the first fire companies in Northampton County to complete a merger. In 2016, Se-Wy-Co and Southeastern merged to create Lower Saucon Fire Rescue. The department will continue to serve from the existing stations located off of Route 378, Leithsville Road, Wassergass Road, and Riverside Drive.

As with any merger of two organizations, there is a lot of behind-the-scenes work which has been in process for months. Several committees have been meeting to ensure the combination of all the financial, training, and service records goes as efficiently as possible. They are also working to develop the operating guidelines of the organization.



LOWER SAUCON TOWNSHIP YARD WASTE COLLECTION FACILTY

This spring, the Township opened a Yard Waste Collection Facility located at 2150 Polk Valley Road, Hellertown, PA 18055. Residents will be able to utilize this facility as a drop off for their yard waste (see items accepted below).

The Yard Waste Collection Facility opened on Friday, April 21st, and will be open each Friday and Saturday through November 17th. Hours of operation are from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. These hours will be evaluated as the facility is used throughout the year and may change. Please use existing orange cards to access the Yard Waste Collection Facility, or contact the Township office if you need a replacement card or a new card.

Items Accepted:

Leaves- loose and in brown paper bags only. If bagged in plastic, you must take the bags home.

Small brush- up to 4" in diameter (no longer than 6 ft.)

Hedge trimmings, garden plant residue

Christmas trees (without tinsel)

Items <u>NOT</u> Accepted:




