## Opening Celebration of Archaea Energy and Waste Connections RNG Plant

Lower Saucon Township Council members were on hand on August 22, 2024 to recognize the opening of Archaea Energy and Waste Connections, Inc., a renewable natural gas (RNG) plant in Lower Saucon Township. The plant, which is adjacent to the Bethlehem Landfill and owned by a Waste Connections subsidiary, came online in July 2024.

Archaea is safely and efficiently scaling up and building momentum with this new plant in the Township. Having brought six plants online in 2024 alone, Archaea is proud to continue its commitment to capturing landfill emissions and providing lower-emission, lower-carbon fuel to customers in Pennsylvania.



## Culvert Projects

The Lower Saucon Township Public Works Department has completed the installation of the new culverts on Black River Road and on Reading Drive. Approved in 2023, the Township is moving forward with addressing road infrastructure improvements on our local roads.

Council continues to invest in road improvements throughout the Township.

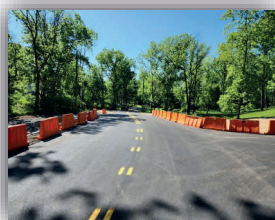
Please thank our Public Works members when you see them and thank you to the residents impacted by the construction.

**About GaGa Ball:** GaGa Ball is believed to have originated in Israel in the 1950s. The term “Ga” means “hit” or “touch” in Hebrew. In the game, the ball must touch the ground twice before it is considered in play, which is how the game got

its name. The objective is to hit the ball at or below opponents’ knees to eliminate them from the pit. The last person remaining in the GaGa Ball pit is the winner, and a new game begins with everyone jumping back in!

GaGa Ball is great because players of any size, age, or athletic ability have an equal chance to win. Games typically last only a few minutes, and eliminated players quickly get back in the action. Once out, players can enjoy watching and cheering on the remaining participants.

Official rules are provided at the court. Please remember to bring your own ball and be considerate of others wanting to use the court.

Lower Saucon Township's Movies in the Park was a tremendous success this year! We hosted three fantastic movie nights:

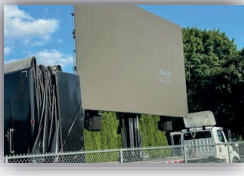

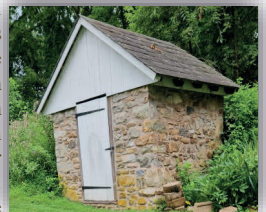

## Yard Waste Facility Reminders

The Yard Waste Collection Facility is located at 2150 Polk Valley Road, Hellertown, PA 18055. Our facility is open for Lower Saucon Residents each Friday and Saturday through November 23<sup>rd</sup>. Hours of operation are 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

### Items Accepted

Leaves - loose and in brown paper bags only. If bagged in plastic, you must take the bags home. Small brush - up to 4" in diameter (no longer than 6 ft.), hedge trimmings, garden plant residue, Christmas trees (without tinsel).

### Items NOT Accepted

Grass, Sod, Tree stumps, Commercial business materials, Yard Waste Materials Must be from a property within Lower Saucon Township, proof of residence will be required.

### Yard Waste Facility Tips

- You must be a Lower Saucon Township resident to drop off materials.
- ID Cards are required (see below). Do NOT leave materials outside the Yard Waste Facility.
- Plastic bags used to transport material must be taken home.
- Grass is NOT accepted. Recycle grass by using a mulching mower or cut your grass frequently and leave clippings on lawn. This does NOT create thatch and provides an excellent lawn fertilizer.

The ID cards should be displayed when you visit the Yard Waste Facility. ID cards may be used by all members residing in your household. The Yard Waste Facility reserves the right to confirm the identification of the card holder to ensure the card is not being misused for non-resident or commercial purposes.

### Tarping Requirements

Visitors are reminded that, per Pennsylvania State Law, all loaded trucks or trailers must be covered with a tarp when traveling on any public road and when dropping off materials at the facility. Please be a good neighbor and tarp your vehicle.

### Contractors

Landscaping contractors hired by a resident OF Lower Saucon Township may drop off brush/yard waste/leaves only with a signed invoice and/or the resident's ID card.

### Yard Waste Facility

ID Cards ID cards issued by Lower Saucon Township are to be used at the Yard Waste Facility. Residents who need a new or replacement ID card may pick them up at Town Hall during regular business hours. A driver's license IS REQUIRED for proof of address as well as your phone number.

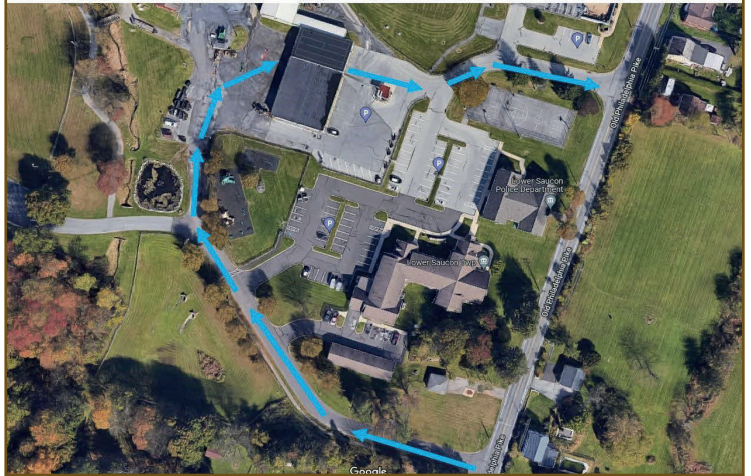
